Cape Churchill, located inside Wapusk National Park is renowned as the best place in the world to photograph polar bears in their element.

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TUNDRA BUGGY LODGE FAQ

Q: What are the accommodations like?

A: The Lodge has two bunkhouses with 20 lower and upper bunks in each (40 bunks total). Each bunk has its own temperature control, sound-dampening curtain, and power outlets. Each bunkhouse is humidity controlled and has three bathrooms (two of the bathrooms have showers with hot running water). Hudson's Bay Company point blankets and towels are provided for your comfort.

Q: How is the food?

A: Amazing. The Lodge has a private chef who makes delicious home cooked meals each day. Hot breakfast, cereal and coffee/tea in the morning, home made soup and sandwiches for lunches on the Tundra Buggies, and local cuisine such as arctic char, bison, or elk for dinner. Each meal is unique and delicious and the chef can accommodate any special dietary requirements with prior notice.

Q: Where can we socialize/share photos at the Lodge?

A: The Lodge has a lounge where guests are invited to mingle before and after dinner to share photos and stories. After dinner guests can partake in presentations from Polar Bears International representatives and Frontiers North staff. The lounge at the Lodge has Wi-Fi access.

Q: How many people can stay at the Lodge?

A: On any visit to Tundra Buggy Lodge there can be up to 40 people staying there at one time. The group will be divided into two bunkhouses of 20 people each.

Q: Why are the accommodation units named Hearne and LaPerouse?

A: They are named after Samuel Hearne, an English explorer, fur-trader, and naturalist and Jean-Francois de Galaup, comte de LaPerouse who was a French naval officer. Both of these men were significant figures in the history of Churchill. Take time to read the posters in each unit more information during your trip.

Packing Suggestions

- Warm hooded parka
- Long underwear
- Snow/ski/wind pants
- Wool sweater
- Wool blend socks
- Fleece sweat pants
- Turtle-necks
- Hooded sweatshirt
- Warm gloves/mitts
- Thin gloves
- Wool hat or toque
- Scarf
- Warm, rubber-soled boots
- Nylon windpants
- Binoculars
- Moisturiser and lip-balm
- Sunglasses
- Personal hygiene products
- Hair dryer
- Slippers
- Ear plugs for light sleepers

Each person is allowed two pieces of checked luggage weighing a combined total of 70 pounds. Soft sided luggage is preferred. Each person is also allowed one carry-on item and one personal item weighing no more than 20 pounds. Please note that storage space inside the aircraft is limited and guests may be asked to store their carry on items in valet service for the duration of the flight. Weather Conditions

Temperature can vary from -20 °C to 0 °C (-4 °F to 32 °F), but strong winds can make the temperature colder (the 'wind chill' factor). The Buggies are heated; however, when we see bears, windows go down and the interior quickly cools. Dressing in warm layers is the best way to stay comfortable.
